Children's Play area

After the deep clean of the surface carpet the previous year, the matting remains in a good state. Thanks also to Andy Alldred for sweeping it clean of leaves.

The Zip wire has been completely revamped with new wires and seat and take off staging at a cost £4500.

The wooden fence remains a problem as it is coming to the end of it's life, and replacement will be in access of £10000. We have applied for a grant to help with this. Thanks to Tina, (Parish Clerk) for pointing us in the right direction, and Suzi for doing all the form filling.

The wooden seat in the toddler's area was falling apart, and the family who put it there have been asked if they would like replace it.

Tennis Courts

Still looking good after the courts refurbishing and repainting, with the new seats. Locks have been changed after the old ones were damaged, and new opening numbers applied, as we were getting people using the courts who had not paid.

Recreation Ground

A new concrete base has been put down to take a new metal shed to house the fete tents, following the dismantling of the old score hut which has left us short of space for the fete equipment. Big thanks to Chris Roberts for helping with the removal.

A new base has been put down in front of the pavilion to take a seat donated by a family who lost a young Sapper in the last war in East Lane. A big thanks to Tina, (PC clerk), for organising this.

Community Garden

With the end of the allotment agreement, it was decided to make the area into a Community Garden. 15'x10' Plots were offered to interested parties, and to date 9 have been taken up. The plot users have helped put up a new fence at the back of the garden to deter deer getting in. A farm gate, donated by Chris Roberts, is being put up to complete the fence area at the back of the hall's grassed area. Suzi is in charge of the community garden.

<u>Village Hall</u>

We have continued with the policy of charging regular clubs with only the electrical costs they use, put in place to help them reestablish after the Covid lock down.

We have bought a new printer, and thanks to Peter Monk for giving us a double fridge to help with the Pop-Up-Pubs.

We have bought a number of fold-up chairs, to help to create more space in the hall, and the orange chairs have been taken to the pavilion for use at the fete.

Plans are in process of refurbishing the Village Hall.

New policies have been put in place for us to continue having Charity status.
