## **ANGLIAN WATER - SYSTEM FLUSHING**

Anglian Water will undertake flushing works affecting Shingle Street/The Street, Bawdsey properties on 26 February (unfortunately notification was received too late for February's Bulletin). However, further flushing works will take place on Monday 2 March, 10.00pm-6.00am affecting the following areas:

Ferry Road, East Lane, Cavell Close, School Lane, Red House Farm Lane, The Manor House Estate, School Road, East Gate Lodge, Bawdsey Manor Estate properties (Farm Cottages, The Old Stables, The Belltower, Dairy Cottage, The Old Farmhouse, Honeymoon Cottage, Garden Cottage, Bawdsey Manor, Alexanders College).

To minimise inconvenience Anglian Water recommends:

- You fill a kettle, or a suitable container, with drinking water before work starts.
- You don't use washing machines and dishwashers, or leave taps open.
- You don't use mains fed instantaneous water hearers/showers if the water supply is interrupted (central heating will be fine).
- If you have a water softener, you should isolate it using the bypass pipe until the work is completed
- You don't fill or change the water in fishponds or tanks for 48 hours

  Once flushing is finished, you may experience discoloured or cloudy water.

  Don't be alarmed just run your kitchen cold water tap until the water runs clear.

With the group fully equipped, with adequate funds and good volunteers, I hand over as Group Co-ordinator to Rod Webb. I like to project manage start up groups and once funding and volunteers are in place, move onto a new project, thus giving someone else the opportunity of running the group.
